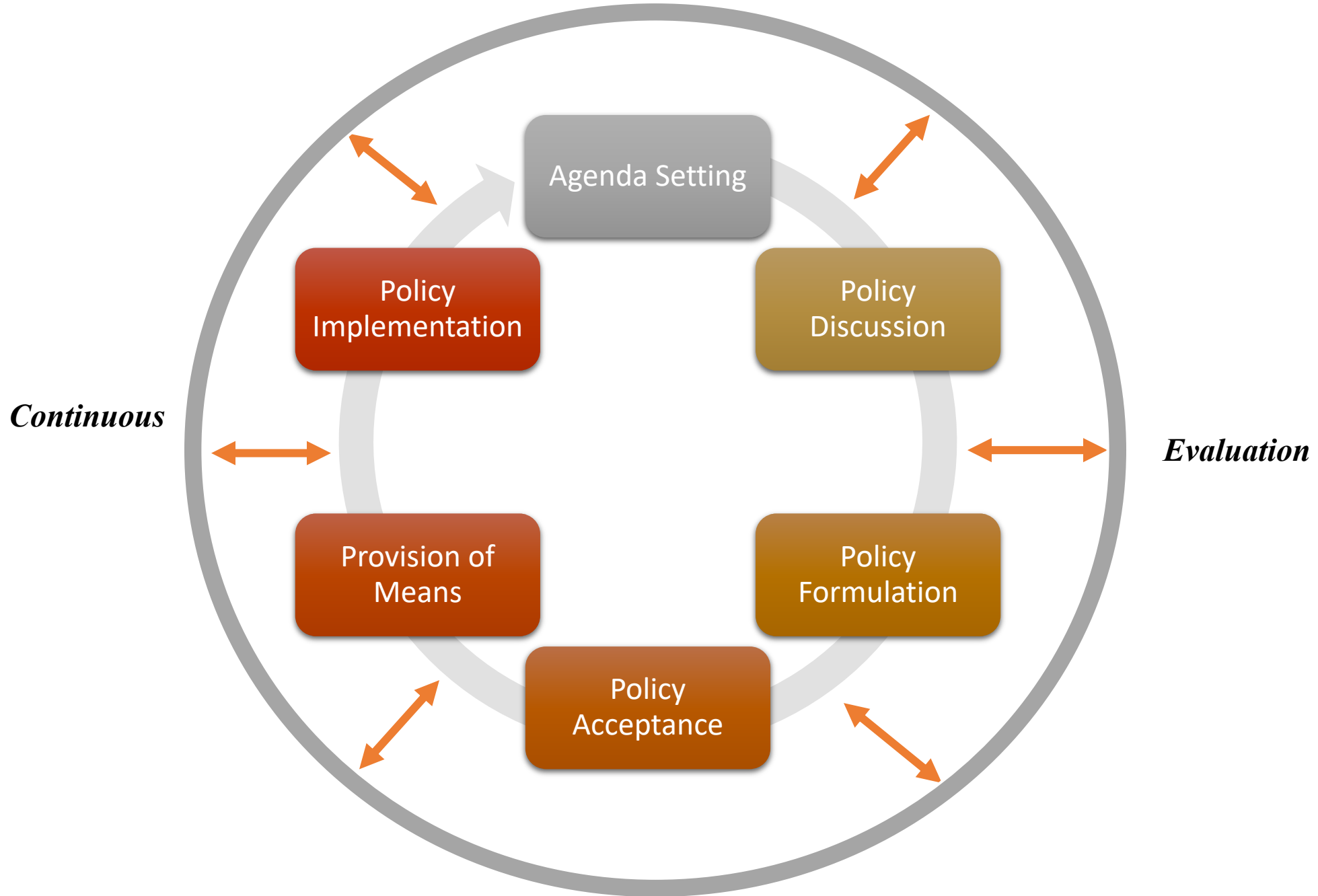

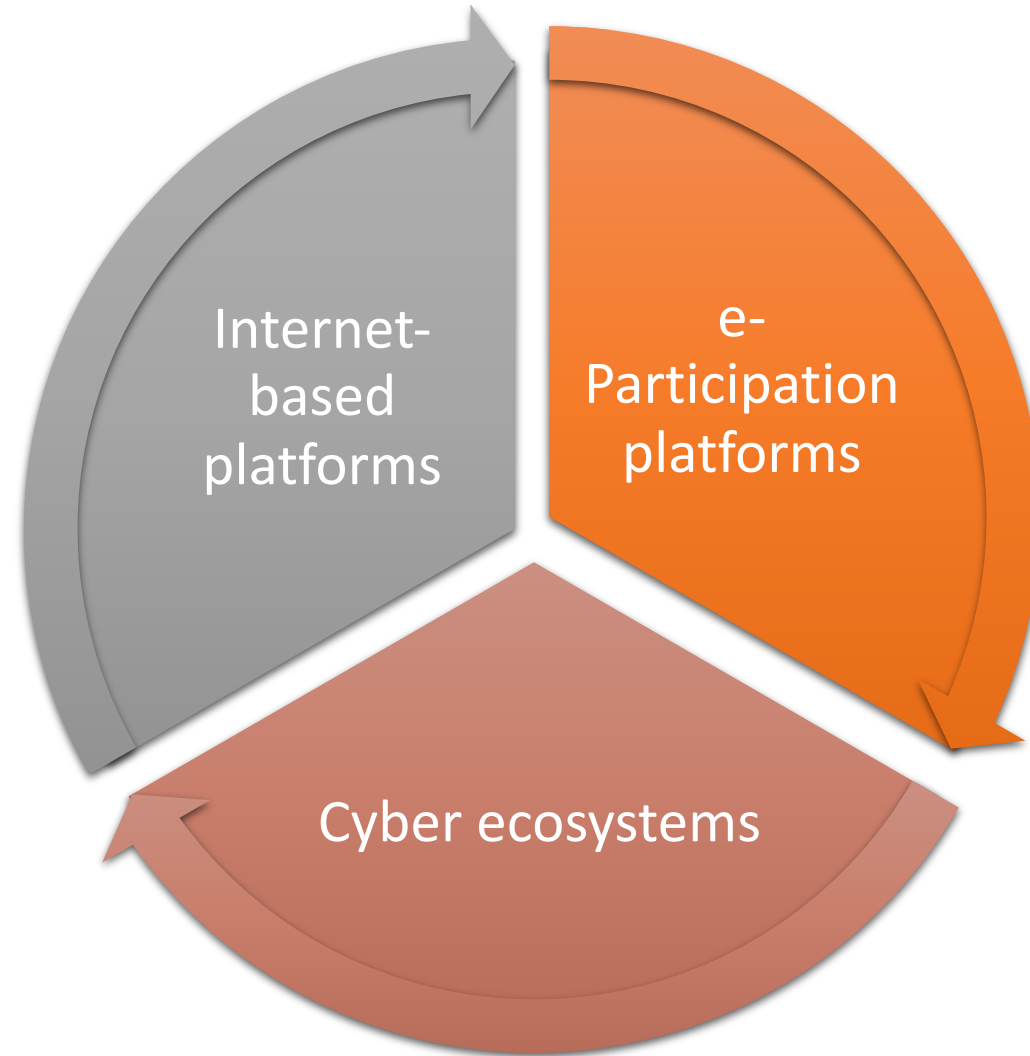
Public Policy Formulation Cycle (Source: By Nachmias & Felbinger, 1982)

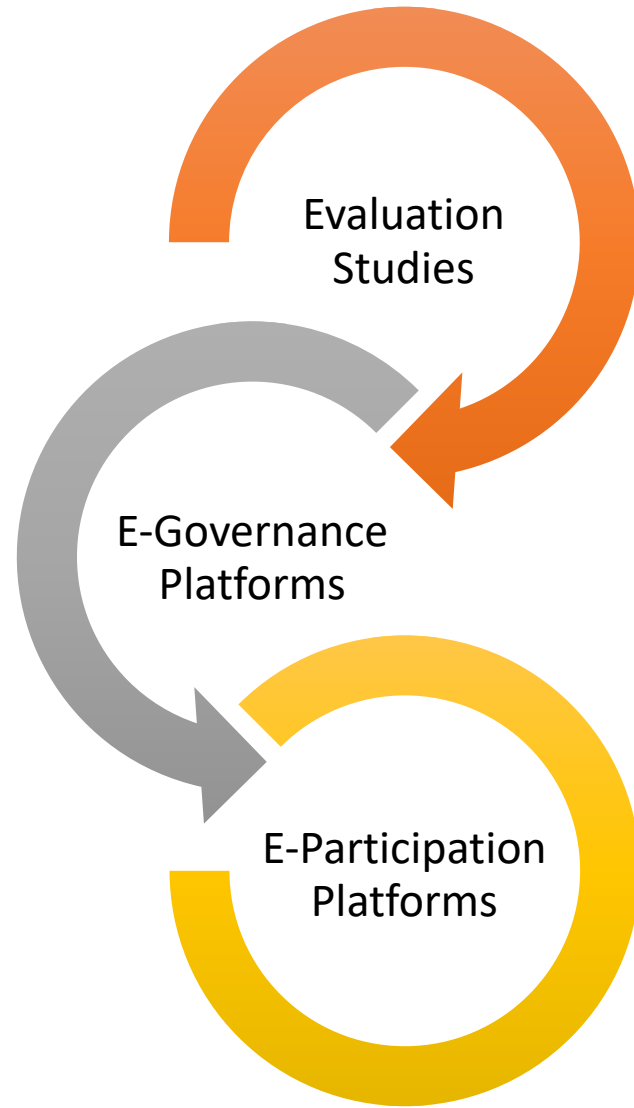

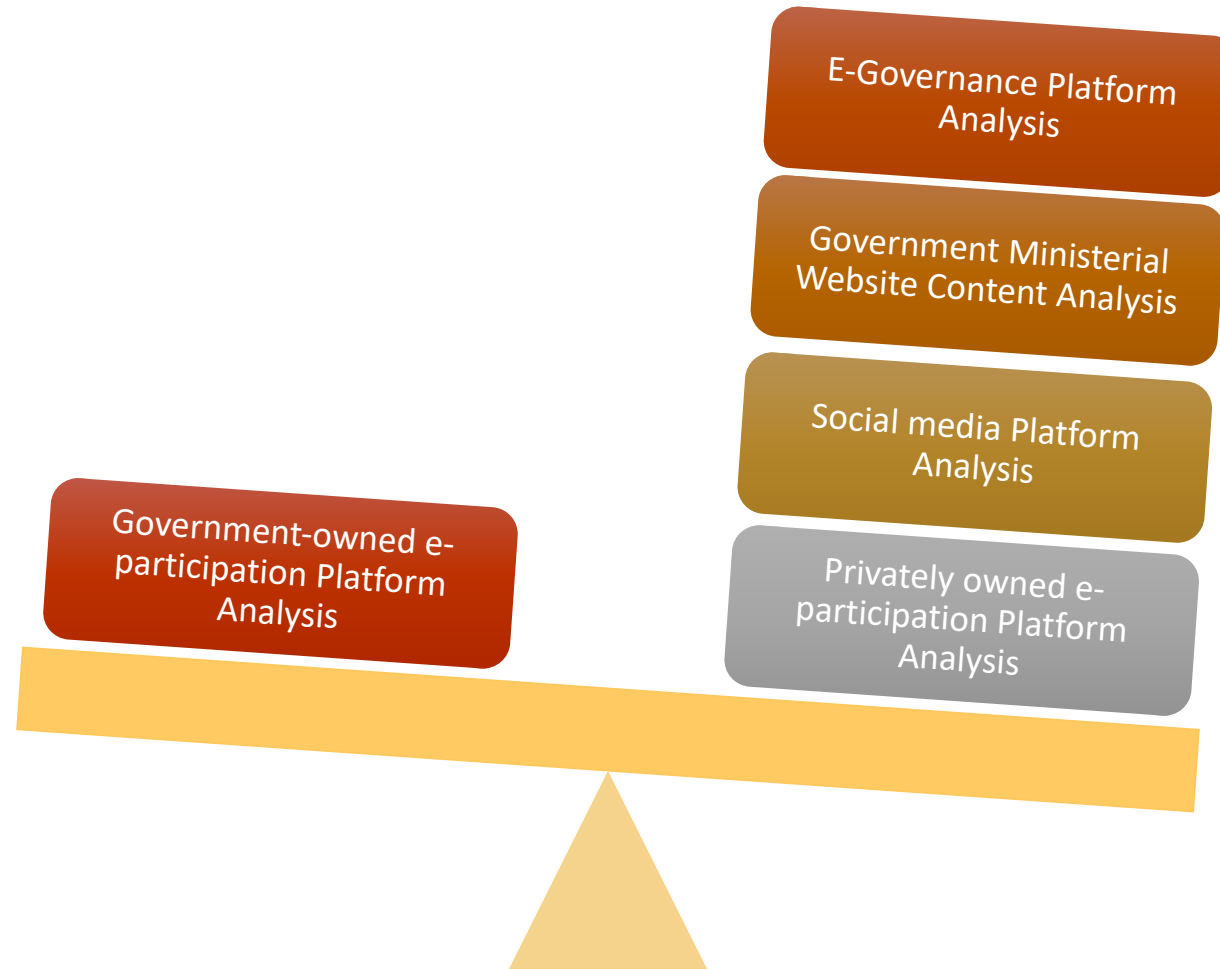
Data Based Policy Cycle (Johann, Peter & Ralph, 2016)

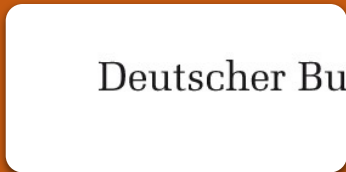

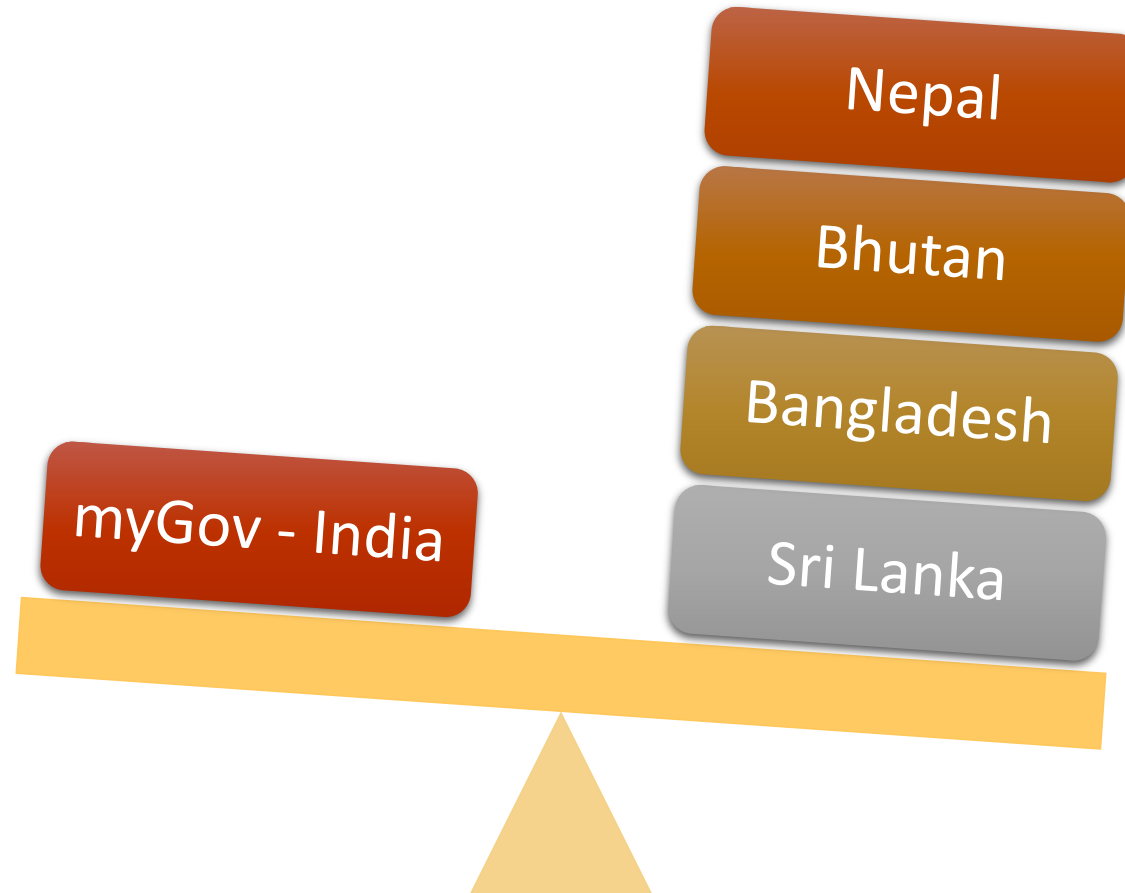

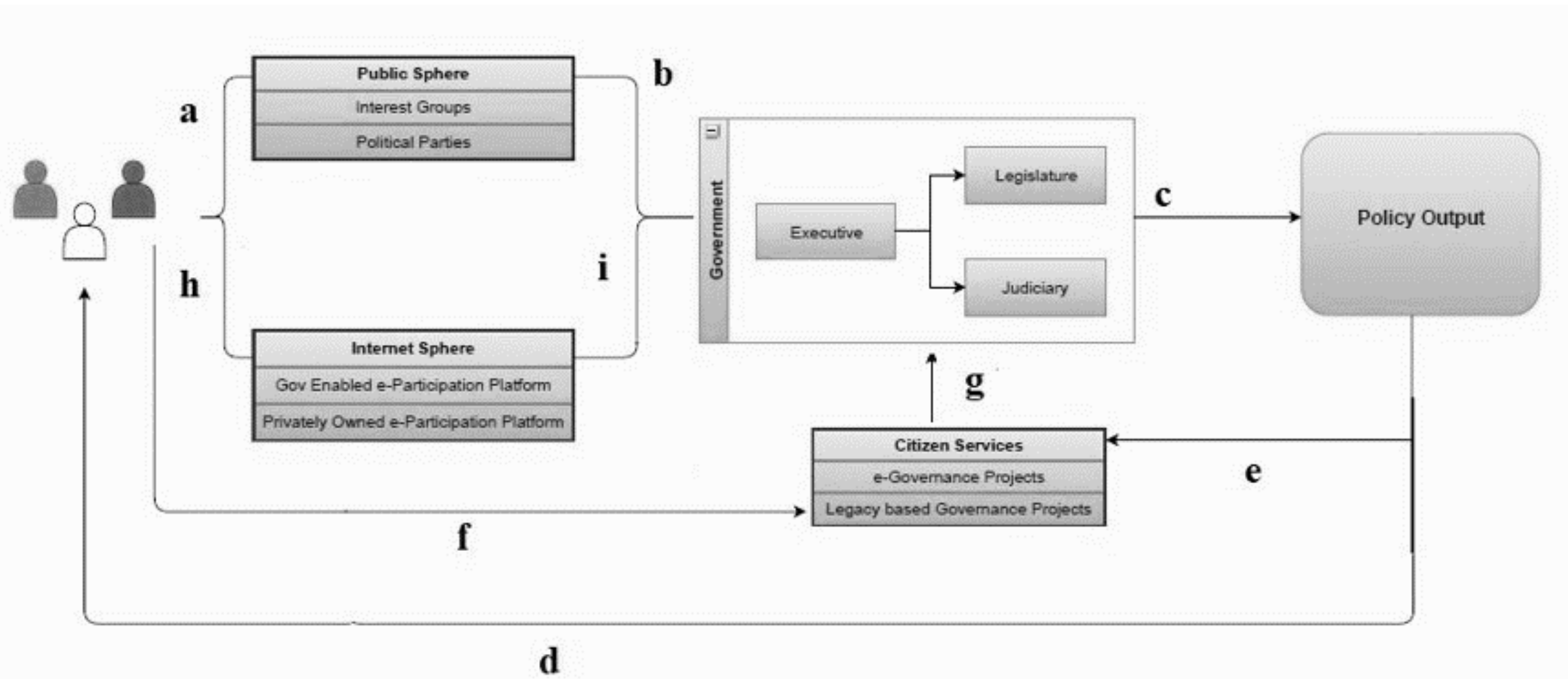

Policy Cycle during pre-ICT Phase : a-b-c-d-f-g

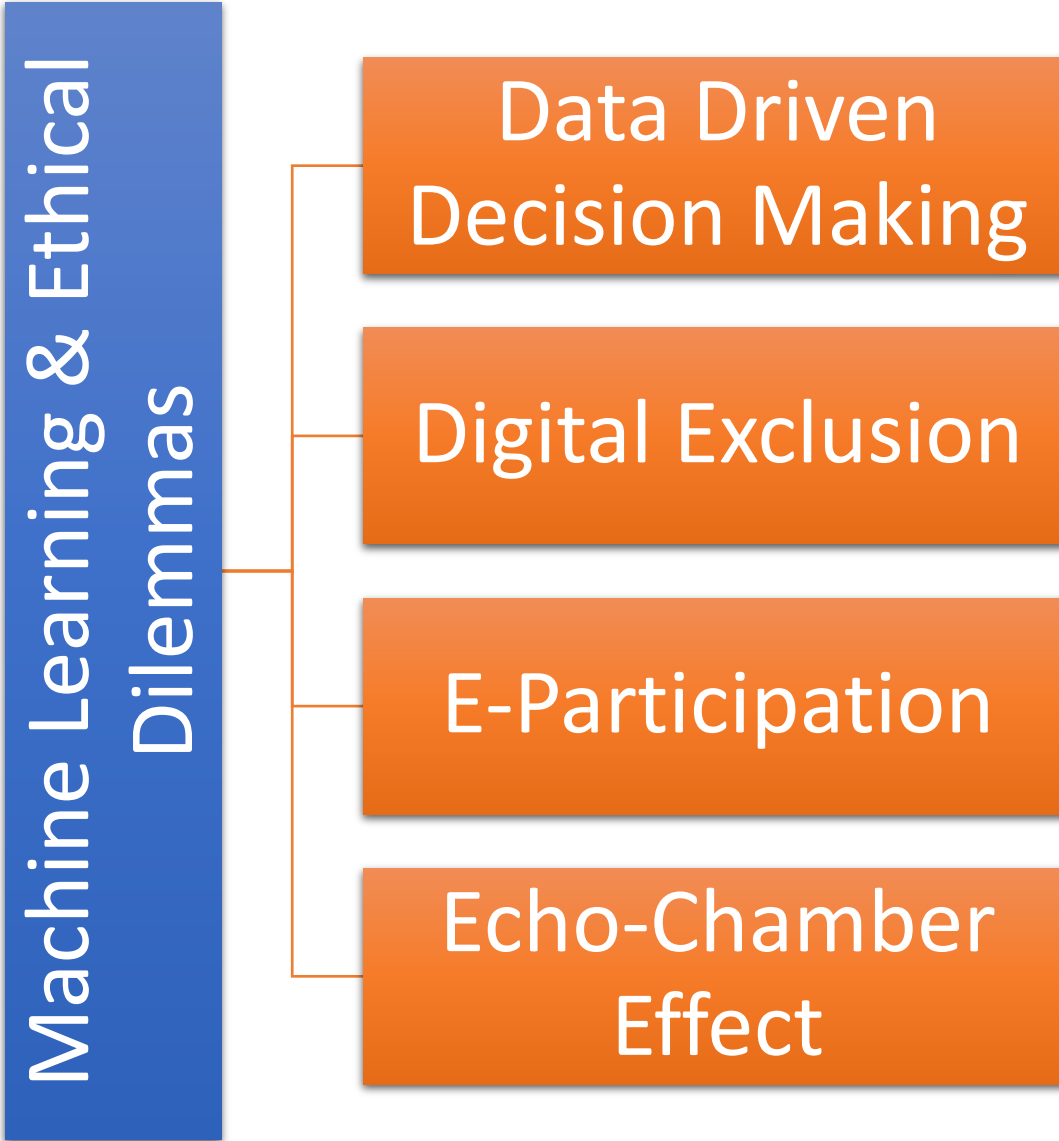
Policy Cycle post e-Government Project Launch: a-b-c-e-f-g

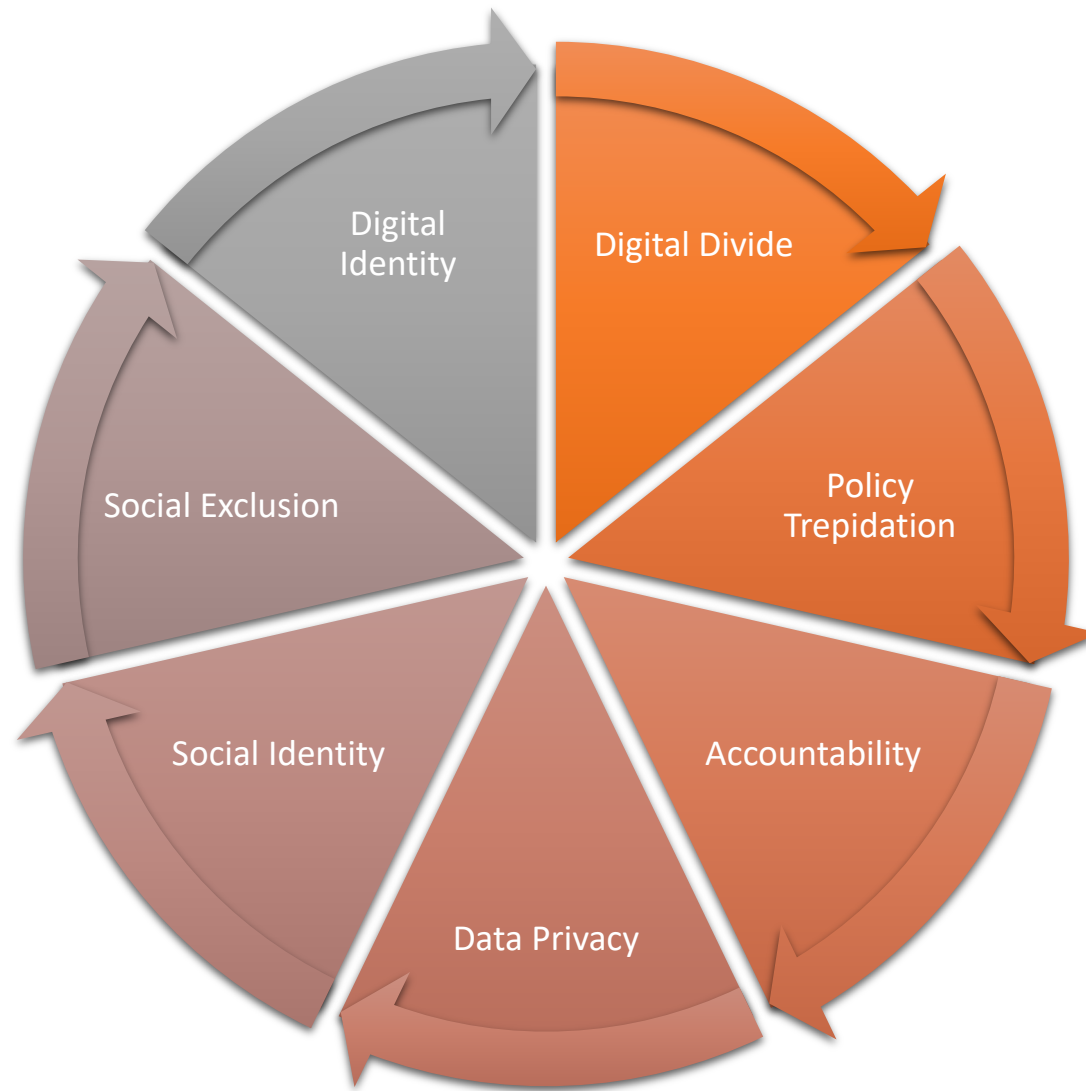
Policy Cycle post e-Participation Platform Launch: h-i-c-e-f-g
