ICTP in a Nutshell


•ICTP is the first and leading global institution for scientific research and development

•Sponsored by tripartite agreement between Italy, IAEA and UNESCO (over 85% of budget from Italy)


 It is an institution that is run by scientists for scientists to support the best science possible in all countries

(since 1995): research and training in Wireless ICT for Development (ICT4D)




