GENERAL INFORMATION FOR PARTICIPANTS TRAVELING TO RWANDA

Welcome to the **"School on Subseasonal to Seasonal Weather and Climate Prediction"**, jointly organized by the Abdus Salam International Centre for Theoretical Physics (ICTP), the East African Institute for Fundamental Research (EAIFR), and the University of Rwanda. The ICTP school will include daily lectures on reanalysis, subseasonal to seasonal forecasting, and predictability, including lectures on ENSO-driven variability and teleconnections. Each afternoon will be spent carrying out hands-on exercises using state-of-the-art products now available on the Copernicus climate data store hosted at ECMWF. These exercises will demonstrate how to access files through python scripts or perform analysis directly at ECMWF using the python-based toolbox. The aim would be to assess some aspect of the seasonal forecast skill in a participants' projects during the ICTP school. The dates for the school are: 29/April – 03/May, 2019.

It might be a little cold in the evening and we would therefore recommend that you bring along a sweater.

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VISAS

If you require a visa to enter Rwanda, you can obtain it on arrival at the airport. It costs \$30. Citizens of certain countries are exempt from paying; see <u>https://irembo.gov.rw/rolportal/web/dgie/single-entry-visa</u>

ELECTRICITY

The AC voltage used Rwanda is 220 -- 240 volts, with frequency of 50Hz. Two-pin plugs are common in Rwanda – similar to the two-pin plugs in Europe.

TIME ZONE

Rwanda is in the Central African Time (CAT) zone, which is UTC+2.

TRANSPORTATION

<u>Airport transfers are being arranged for visitors subsidized by ICTP/ EAIFR (upon receipt of their exact</u> fight schedule). For your personal business, please only use licensed/metered taxis. Generally, transport in Kigali is easy and accessible. A taxi ride from the airport to most places in Kigali costs 10,000 to 15,000 Rwandan Francs (RWF), equivalent of \$12 -\$18. Depending on the distance, taxi rides within the city range from 3,000 to 10,000 RWF (\$4-\$12).

MONEY

You can exchange money at foreign exchange bureaus, either at the airport or at banks in Kigali. However, using banks might take a little longer than an exchange bureau.

Most banks are open from 08.00 am – 6.00 pm on weekdays (Monday to Friday) and on Saturday 8.00am to 1.00 pm; on Sundays 10.00 am to 6.00 pm. On the Umuganda Day (last Saturday of every month) banks in Kigali open from 2.00 to 6.00 pm. Credit cards are accepted at most supermarkets, restaurants and hotels in Kigali. In rural areas, vendors would generally feel comfortable only with money in Rwanda Francs. Most banks in East Africa have difficulty accepting MasterCard. In Kigali, Ecobank and Access Bank accept MasterCard withdrawals at a price. (https://kabiza.com/kabiza-wilderness-safaris/rwanda-money-information-for-tourists-visitors/)

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EXCHANGE RATE

Exchange rates may vary from bank to bank and also between exchange bureaus according to their location. However, the rate will not differ greatly from the National Bank of Rwanda (BNR) rate. As posted on 23 April 2019 at 12:00 am on NBR, here are the rates for USD, Euros, and GB Pound Sterling.

ATM MACHINES

ATM machines are available at nearly every bank, at the airport, and on campus at the workshop venue. You can use both Visa and Mastercard as well as credit and debit cards, which can make life a lot easier over carrying a lot of cash with you. But it is always useful to carry some extra USD or Euros in Cash as backup, just in case.
