**Open science, done wrong, will compound inequalities: Reflections on dynamics of cumulative advantage and threats to equity in open environments.** Open Science holds the promise to make scientific endeavours more accessible, and re-usable for audiences. However, making processes open will not per se drive wide re-use or participation unless also accompanied by the capacity to do so.

**SciPost and the reform of scientific publishing.** SciPost is a not-for-profit publishing initiative conceived, implemented and run by scientists. It aims to increase the meaningfulness of the peer refereeing process. Committed to scientific quality, it offers high-quality publishing venues, thereby bringing control of publishing into the hands of active academics.
